The Special Foundation (TSF) is a privately funded social impact organization focused on building Africa's next set of leaders by refining their minds through education. We are a community of young professionals with a vision to improve the quality of leadership in all spheres of governance in Africa by creating access for more children to get an education.

The foundation was created to solve one of the challenges Nigeria (and Africa at large) is facing; High rates of children that are out of school. Africa is blessed with large human and mineral resources, but there are deep-rooted issues; The quality of education. And if the continent is to reap the productivity and growth benefits of its growing population, its stakeholders (TSF) will need to ensure that its people have the right knowledge, skills, and opportunities.

Currently, there are over 13 million children out of school in Nigeria, and a major cause of this poverty. Lack of funds for parents to send their kids and also a poverty mindset. Neglecting these large numbers of children who are out of school, will endanger the future of Nigeria.

We are bridging the widening gap between children out of school and access to quality education. By the year 2030, we believe at least 1 million Africans will be positively impacted by the Foundation. Through our 6 cardinal programs, we exercise our mission.

#### INSPIRE SCHOLARSHIP -

This is merit-based and targeted at identifying gifted students for local tertiary institutions. This scholarship is available to students under the age of 21.

This initiative is focused on improving educational infrastructureandensuring more children have access to safe and quality learning environments.




#### LIFE LONG DEVELOPMENT -



## INSPIRE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

This program was created to provide scholarships for children of low-income earners, orphaned children, and families that have lost a breadwinner. The initiative focuses on primary and secondary school students.

We are committed to supporting and sponsoring the educational needs of children under this scholarship. This scholarship covers the cost of tuition, books, stationery, and other necessary materials for school.

Join us in our fight to reduce the number of out-of-school children and the level of illiteracy, poverty, and bad leadership by equipping the next generation with quality education It costs about 350 dollars to sponsor a child for a year.









Glory (6) is a brilliant student who loves dancing. She is the third child out of four kids. Her parents are petty traders. Glory was nominated for the Inspire Scholarship by her dance teacher. The scholarship has relieved her parents of some of the financial burden, so they can provide better education for her 3 siblings too.

## SPECIAL SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM





This program is designed to offer out-of-school and less privileged children continued and all-around capacity development. The program is in its 8th year of operation and runs for about 3-5 weeks, during the summer holidays (August to September).

The age range of target participants is from 8 to 18 years.

The curriculum is designed to cater to the needs of children currently out of school and to improve the quality of education of those currently in school. A baseline test will be administered at the beginning of the program to test each child's strength and ensure they are placed in the correct class set. A baseline test will also be administered at the end of the program to measure the impact of the summer school program.

At the end of the program, the participants are equipped with various skillsets such as mental mathematics, creative writing, ICT, public speaking, and craftsmanship.

Last year, over 500 children participated in this program through our Makoko, Lagos, and Kuje, Abuja centers, and in 2022 we plan to reach over 2000 children in four states; two in the north and south.

The budget for the summer school is 36 thousand dollars per center/state. Watch this video to find out more about the program.



#### SPECIAL SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM





Destiny's sister, Happiness was one of the kids selected from the Kuje community to participate in the Summer School Program. Destiny had been out of school due to financial constraints on her mother and she insisted on accompanying her big sister to the classes. Destiny was tested to determine her strength academically and passed the test.

While at the program, Destiny's spelling and diction improved greatly, and at the end of the summer school program, Happiness and Destiny emerged top in their individual classes. Both girls received gifts for their academic feats and Destiny was selected as one of the students to benefit from the Inspire Scholarship.

Destiny's zeal to learn was also a factor in why she was chosen.

Her mother expressed gratitude to the foundation for the opportunity given to her children; she was extremely surprised that one of her kids got a scholarship. The scholarship meant she doesn't have to worry about school fees for Destiny.

Destiny is currently enrolled at one of our partner schools, Kazahchat in Abuja and she has been a beneficiary of the Inspire Scholarship for the last 3 years. She continues to excel academically and is always eager to improve her learning.

Destiny's story is just one example of the positive impact of our program. We believe that there are many kids like Destiny who are out of school who can attend the summer school program, benefit from the knowledge and skills and develop an interest in school.



## THE SCHOOL School BUILD PROGRAM









Our School Build Program is focused on building resilient educational infrastructure to make sure that students have access to safe learning environments. Through this program, students have a better chance of reaching their best potential.

The schools which have benefited from this program were recommendations from our partners. So far, we have been able to renovate and improve the aesthetic appeal of a few schools which has improved the learning outcome of over 2500 students.

The budget for the school builds program is 10 thousand dollars per school. This will provide a conducive environment for 500 students. (20 dollars per child).

#### 360 KIDDIES







Mrs. Mosumola, Proprietress **360 Kiddies in Ajegunle**, Lagos has taken it upon herself to cater to the educational needs of children in her community. With little support, some of the students who attend this school have been able to graduate and further their education.

However, the conditions of the learning environment are not favorable. The number of students has increased and the classrooms cannot accommodate them. They attend classes in a dilapidated building, with little ventilation, poor lighting, and creaky tables and chairs. These classes can barely protect the kids from the uncertainty of the elements. When it rains, classes are disrupted by leakages from the poorly roofed building and windowless classrooms.

We are committed to making sure that children in the Ajegunle community and others like this have access to a conducive learning environment that will enable them to have better access to quality education.
